A tempo - *return to the previous tempo*

Accelerando - *gradually get faster*

Ad lib - *the performer can vary the music if they wish*

Adagio - *slow, slower than andante but faster than largo*

Allargando - *broadening*

Allegretto - *a small bit slower than allegro*

Allegro - *fast*

Andante - *at a walking pace*

Cantabile - *in a singing style*

Con - *with*

Con moto - *with motion*

Crescendo - *gradually getting louder*

Decrescendo - *gradually getting softer*

Diminuendo - *gradually getting softer*

Dolce - *sweetly*

Espressivo - *expressively*

Fermata - *hold or pause*

Fine - *the end*

Forte - *loud*

Fortissimo - *very loud*

Grave - *slow and solemn*

Largo - *slow*

Lento - *slow*

Legato - *smooth*

Meno mosso - *less motion*

Mezzo - *half*

Moderato - *moderate speed*

Molto - *very*

Mosso - *rapid*

Moto - *motion*

Non troppo - *not too much*

Pesante - *heavily*

Peu a peu - *little by little*

Piano - *soft*

Pianissimo - *very soft*

Piano-forte - *soft to loud*

Piu - *more*

Poco - *a little*

Presto - *very fast*

Primo - *first*

Quasi - *almost*

Ritardando - *gradually getting slower*
